Carr Fire

Mr. Hauser reviewed the timeline of the Carr Fire with the Board which began Monday, July 23rd by the Carr Powerhouse. He described how the electricity is delivered to the District and the locations of the Western Area Power Administrations 230kV and 60kV power lines.

Mr. Hauser reviewed with the Board the dates, times, and reason for all 8 outages that the District experienced from July 27th through August 6th.
