a. General Manager's Reports

Land Exchange

Mr. Hauser advised that there is no new information on the Land Exchange.

Power Outages

The Outage Summary for October 8, 2019 – November 12, 2019, was provided to the Board. Mr. Hauser advised that the majority of the outages were PG&E Public Safety Power Shut-offs. He also advised that due to the ongoing dry

conditions, the District remains on 'one shot,' meaning reclosers will open creating an outage with the first disruption to a line.

Balancing Authority of Northern California (BANC)

Mr. Hauser provided information relative to a recent BANC meeting he attended. There was significant discussion about natural gas, carbon emissions, and other utilities goals to be net carbon free. He reminded the Board that Trinity PUD is already 100% carbon free.

• California Energy Commission (CEC) - Solar Rooftop Exemption

Mr. Hauser advised that the Rooftop Solar Exemption for Trinity County continues to move forward with the CEC. The item is agendized for the December meeting, and is supported by CEC staff.

Western Area Power Administration (WAPA) Fiber

Mr. Hauser advised that he is in receipt of a draft agreement prepared by WAPA, whereby the District would provide access to the Oregon Mountain Communications Site in exchange for access to WAPA's fiber, improving communications for both WAPA and the District.

Fiber and Communications Upgrade

Mr. Hauser reported that a request was made to Brown & Kysar, Inc. (BKI), to submit a quote to design a fiber and communications upgrade to the District's radio system. The goal is to upgrade our existing radio communications to handle location information and data communication, to improve employee safety and enhance efficiency by providing the ability to operate equipment (such as reclosers) remotely, reducing the District's response time in the event of an emergency. BKI has submitted a quote in the amount of approximately \$50,000, for the work.

Mr. Hauser requested that the Board approve closing the office at noon on Tuesday, December 24, 2019. Christmas Eve is typically a very slow day in the office.
