6. Reports

a. <u>Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) Reporting Metrics Update – September 2025</u>
Mr. DeLange reviewed the September 2025 Reporting Metrics with the Board, noting that the District is no longer on one-shot as fire season is coming to a close.

b. General Manager's Reports

i.Land Exchange

Mr. Hauser reported that there has been no progress on the land exchange, as the federal government is currently shut down.

ii.Balancing Authority of Northern California (BANC)

Mr. Hauser reported that the process for BANC to move into the Extended Day Ahead Market continues to move forward slowly, with a target date in 2027. Membership in BANC saves the District up to \$2,000,000 per year vs. participation in the California Independent System Operator (ISO) by avoiding transmission charges.

iii.Power Outage Summary, September 2025

Mr. Hauser reviewed the power outage summary with the Board. Most of the outages were caused by lightning storms or maintenance.

iv.Right of Way Project Update

Mr. Delange advised that the District has begun work on the Right of Way Project. Work has begun on a large privately owned parcel, with a landowner who is a willing participant in removing trees near powerlines. The Timber Harvest Plan for the project includes a 50-foot buffer for defensible space around the District's Right of Way.

NWPPA Washington DC Trip -

Lobbying on the Fix our Forests Act – some provisions that would really help the District.

v.Grants Update

Ms. Sheetz reported that there has been some progress on the grant status for the following grants currently being tracked: United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Community Wildfire Defense Grant, \$9.5 million funded by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill (IIJA) Status: Staff had a kick-off meeting with ICF.

Community Facilities Grant – Sno Cat acquisition, \$236,140. Status: Funds have been obligated, Sno Cat has been ordered.

Community Facilities Grant (FY 2026) – Fault Tamers, \$523,499 Status: Notified by Congressman Huffman's office that this application is being moved forward, but has been reduced to \$360,000. Award is dependent on Congress passing a budget.

Cal Fire – Fuels Reduction Grant, \$950,000 Status: Application for a shaded fuel break on the 60kV line from Weaverville to Hayfork submitted and under review, expected notification in October/November 2025.
